

Guidelines for Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds

1. The school's finance committee or financial officer is to determine the student's financial need and the finance committee and or board is to oversee the distribution of these funds making certain that the need is legitimate.
2. The Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds may only be used for students in grades 1-12.
3. The student must have Adventist parents or grandparents.
4. The school must contribute worthy student or Keep Scholarship funds towards the financial obligation of each student receiving Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds.
5. The parent must contribute towards the financial obligation of their student or students receiving Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds.
6. In no case is more than 50% of the total school bill to be covered by Ed Hunt Scholarship funds.
7. Students receiving Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds are to maintain acceptable attendance, grades and behavior standards as determined by the local school board.
8. Half of the money will be distributed at the beginning of the first semester. If the student is registered during the second half of the year, the remaining funds will be distributed in January.
9. If a student drops out of school, the unused portion of the Ed Hunt Worthy Student Funds are to be returned to the Conference Office of Education
