

What are the other papers in this packet?

1. The **Delegate/Sponsor Commitment Form** and **Health Form** must be returned to us immediately. It lets us know that you're still planning on coming to Guatemala and has information that we will need in case of an emergency in Guatemala.
2. The **Fundraising Suggestions and Plans** are there to help you get going with some ideas. Read them carefully and put them into action! Call if you need help.
3. The **Youth Mission Adventure Supporter Letter** is a sample letter for you to send to the people on your support list. You can copy this letter or use it as a guide for writing your own, more personal, letter.
4. The **Donation Record Form** (see the bottom of the suggested supporter letter) can be duplicated and sent along with your supporter letter. It's a way to make it clear to your supporters what to do with their contributions.
5. The **What to Bring** list is very important. If you have questions, don't hesitate to call the Youth Department.
6. The **Dress Code** sheet will help you know what kind of clothing you want to bring along in order to be comfortable as well as respectful to the culture we will be in.

What do I pack my things in?

The airline allows each person to check two reasonably-sized, 50-pound bags, along with one carry-on that can fit under the seat or in the overhead bins. The dimensions of checked bags must not be more than 62 inches when you total length, width, and height. Because of the need to transport supplies, we're allowing you *one* checked bag and your carry-on bag for personal belongings. The second checked bag will be assigned to you at the airport and you will be responsible for keeping track of it until we get to our final destination. This bag contains supplies we'll need for our work on the project.

Some people have found it useful to take a duffel bag, as it's great for squishing in a sleeping bag, sheets, toilet paper, extra bulky clothes, and even shoes. It should be the size that, standing on end, reaches somewhere around your stomach. The airlines won't accept any of those huge bags. Remember, you'll only have one large bag to pack your belongings in, so plan carefully as you pack. That bag must include your sleeping bag, and all the other things that you'll need or want on our trip.
